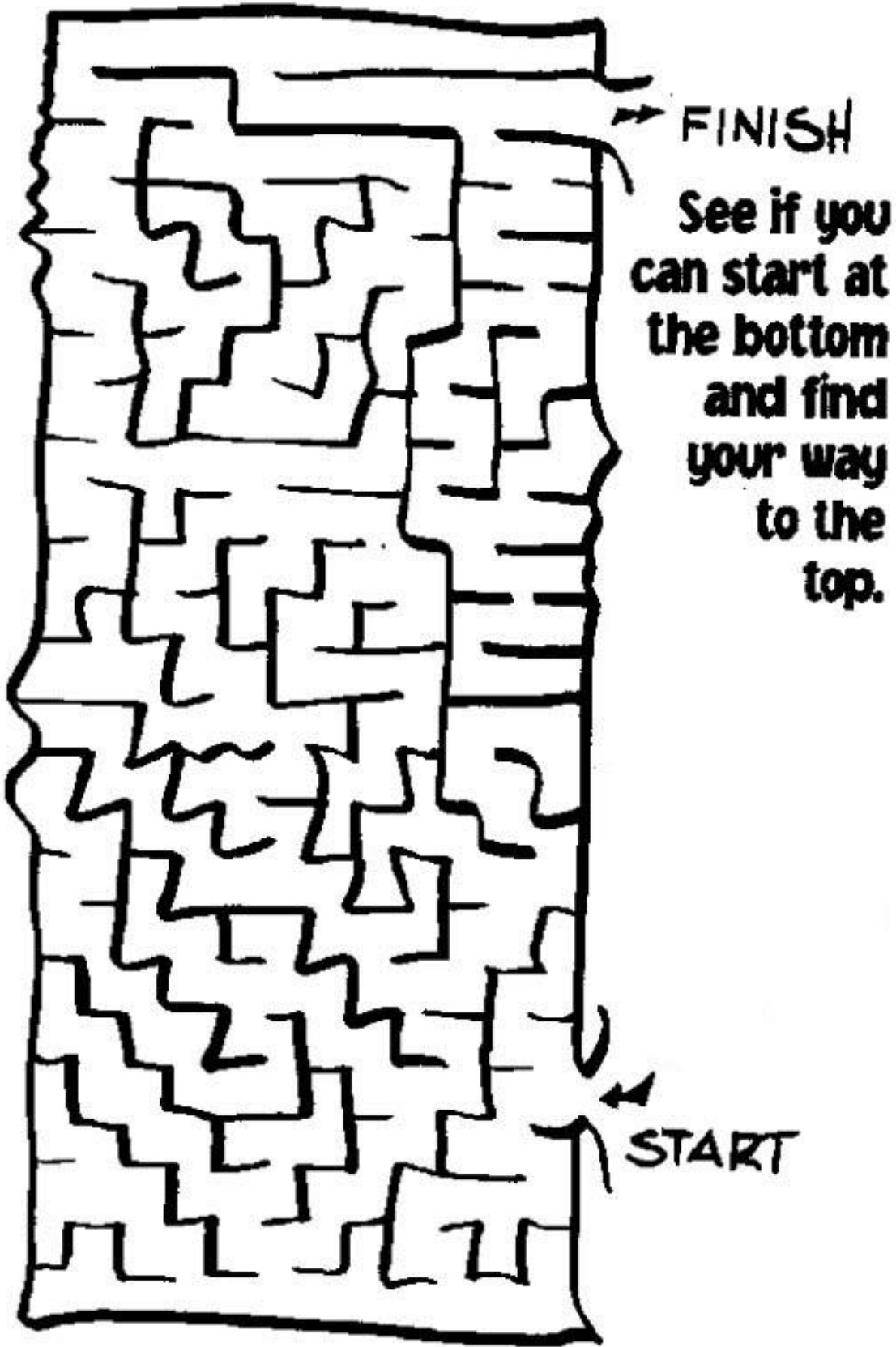

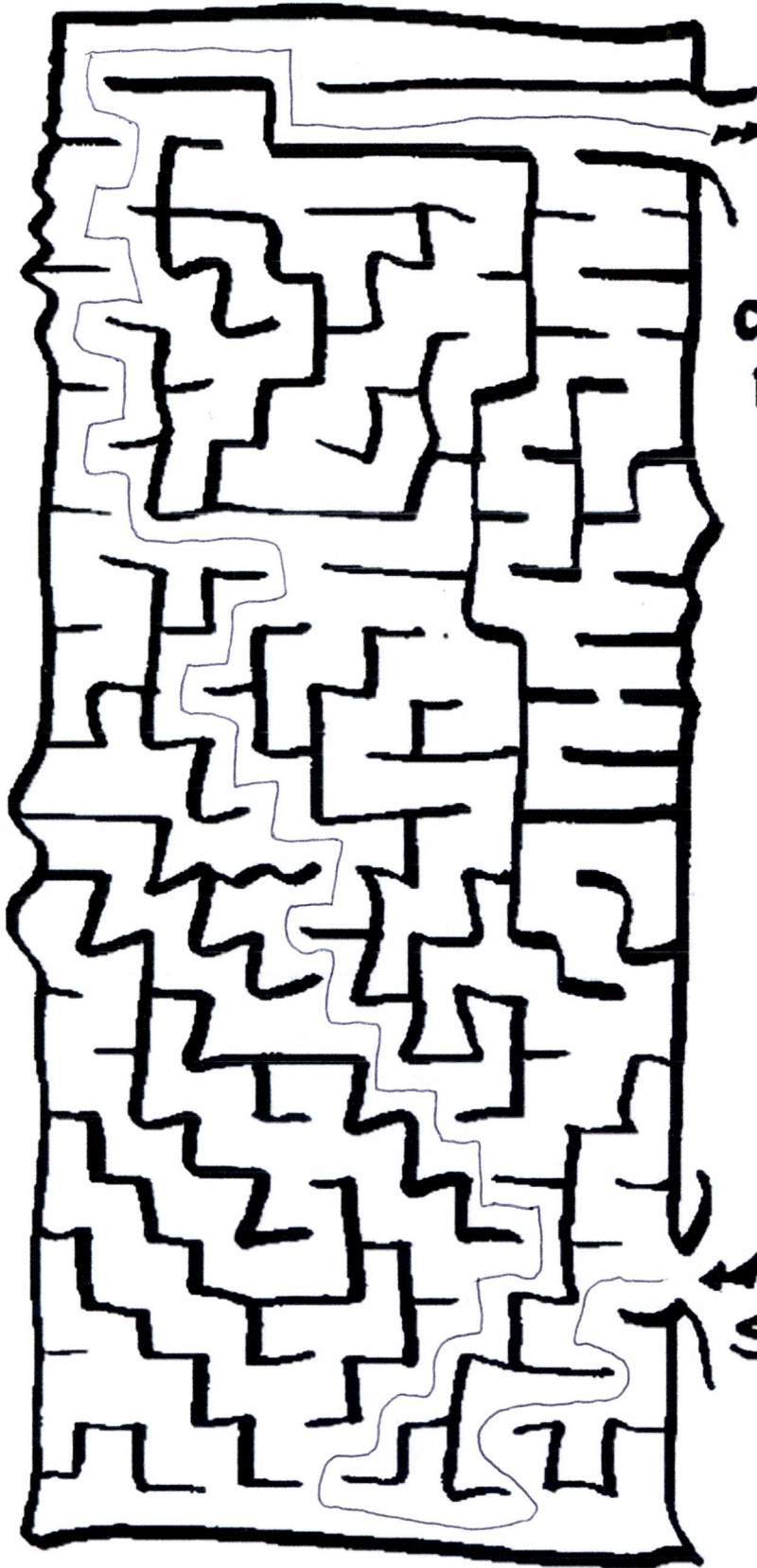

Materials:
